Ryedale Book Festival

On Saturday 30th June, young fans of David Attenborough can enjoy Mike Unwin's Incredible Animal Journeys based on the research for his new title, 'Migration'. Tickets are £3 each or £10 for a family.

Also at the library, children can hear the story 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers, a heart-warming story about a boy and a penguin and their special journey together. At this story-time session for young children you can listen to the story, join in a craft activity as well as take part in a treasure hunt around Malton Library.

Suitable for EYFS and KS1

In between events, the whole family can join in the free Treasure Trail at participating shops in Malton town centre.

On Saturday evening, enjoy some 'Travelling Tales' by our friend, fabulous storyteller Ian Douglas, who has gathered stories from tellers, festivals, events and chance meetings, from lands near and far. Travelling Tales promises to be an evening that will certainly stir up your inner wanderlust and send your imagination on walkabout!

On Sunday 1st July, come on a family walk with Andrew White, one of the country's foremost authorities on walking – regularly writing for publications such as BBC Countryfile, Discover Britain and the AA Guide to Yorkshire.

Especially for Ryedale Book Festival Andrew has agreed to lead a six mile walk along a section of the Wolds Way from East Heslerton to Scampston Park, near Rillington. Don't worry if you are visiting Ryedale without a car because transport will be provided, leaving Malton Town Centre at 10am.

Tickets are £15 for adults, £5 for ages 12-17 and free for children aged 11 and under. Tickets include entrance to Malton Show and transport. Pre-booking is essential (before Friday 29th June at 6pm) so we can make transport arrangements.
