

## St. Benedict's R.C. Primary School PE and Sport Premium 2014 - 2015 & 2015-16

Our PE and Sports funding for 2014-15 was £7863 which was used in the following ways:

Details	Cost	Impact
Local Cluster Sports Partnership: Participation in the local cluster sports partnership. This included weekly 'Gifted & Talented' sessions for older pupils and sports competitions against other schools.	<b>£1100</b>	3 older children took part in the weekly sessions which increased their skills and knowledge in a range of sports - children completed evaluations at the end of the year and all agreed the sessions had made an impact. The inter-school competitions allowed a range of children to compete against other schools and this included SEND and disadvantaged pupils thus boosting their personal esteem. Children were successful in winning qualification for events like County cross-country and regional girls' football final.
Weekly swimming: Children across KS2 took part in weekly swimming sessions run by the local sports centre.	<b>£1723</b>	Many were able to progress and gain swimming awards. The school team was successful in winning the inter-schools swimming gala thus boosting esteem especially amongst some SEND and disadvantaged pupils.
Sports coaches: The school was able to fund two specialist sports coaches who came in and delivered PE to pupils across all age phases weekly. This included the provision of an after school football club.	<b>£4290</b>	Pupils skills and knowledge have improved and many children have been motivated by the sessions. The sessions have also helped promote enjoyment and engagement in PE - this has been highlighted by pupil discussions. Involvement in the football club doubled from 20 to 40 pupils during the year (September to July).
Gymnastics Equipment: This included new mats, agility tables and wall bars/frame for the school hall.	<b>£2770 (£750 of funding used, balance provided from other school funding)</b>	The new equipment has enabled staff to improve the teaching of gymnastics in the school. It has also motivated pupils and increased their engagement.

Our PE and Sports funding for **2015-16** is expected to be **£8475** and will be used in the following way (the impact of the initiatives will be assessed at the end of the academic year in August 2016):

Details	Cost
Local Cluster Sports Partnership: Participation in the local cluster sports partnership. This will include weekly 'Gifted & Talented' sessions for older pupils and sports competitions against other schools.	<b>£1100</b>
Weekly swimming: Children across KS2 will take part in weekly swimming sessions run by the local sports centre.	<b>£1723</b>
Sports coaches: After the success of the programme in 2014-15, the school will fund two specialist sports coaches to come in and deliver PE to pupils across all age phases weekly. This will include the provision of an after school football club.	<b>£4290</b>
Gymnastics Equipment: The school will refurbish PE benches that will be used in the gymnastics scheme of work.	<b>£200</b>
Fitness coach: The school will fund a fitness coach in the autumn term to deliver four sessions to older children. The aim will be to develop fitness skills and will culminate in a competition against other local primaries.	<b>£250</b>
Transport: The school will fund coaches to transport children to inter-school sports competitions in the area thus giving all types of children, including more 'vulnerable' learners the chance to take part in competitive sport.	<b>£245</b>
PE Equipment: The school will replenish equipment, like footballs, goalposts and playtime sports equipment to encourage participation in sport (this follows discussions at a school council meeting).	<b>£1000</b>

NB: This amounts to **£8808** so the additional amount will come from other school funds.
