<p>Local Cluster Sports Partnership: Participation in the local cluster sports partnership. This included weekly 'Gifted &amp; Talented' sessions for older pupils and sports competitions against other schools</p>	<p>£1200</p>	<p>The inter-school competitions allows a range of children to compete against other schools and this included SEND and Pupil Premium pupils The children participated in many activities throughout the year, including winning some of the competitions such as Cross Country and Football.</p>
<p>Sports coaches: The school was able to fund two specialist sports coaches who came in and delivered PE to pupils across all age phases weekly. This included the provision of an after school football club.</p>	<p>£5350</p>	<p>Pupil's core skills, teamwork and knowledge of tactics have improved. Numerous children have been motivated by the sessions. The sessions have also helped promote enjoyment and engagement in PE .</p>
<p>Fitness coach: The school will fund a fitness coach for children in Class 4. The aim will be to develop fitness skills and will culminate in a competition against other local primaries.</p>	<p>£550</p>	<p>Children had the opportunity to take part in weekly sport sessions delivered by trained coaches.  Children took part in a sports competition against other schools</p>
<p>Dance Coach. The school will fund a trained dance coach throughout periods in the year. The aim is to develop dance skills in children from Year 2 –Year 6</p>	<p>£1,700</p>	<p>Excellent participation and enjoyment throughout each session. Performances to members of the school. School staff who participated are more confident to lead a dance and movement session to develop children's creativity and dance.</p>
<p>Transport: The school will fund coaches to transport children to inter-school sports competitions in the area.</p>	<p>£440</p>	<p>Children who were able to attend the school sports competitions were enthused and keen to take part in further activities.  Number of children willing and keen to enter sports competitions rose significantly.</p>
<p>PE Equipment: The school will purchase new equipment, (dedicated sports and playtime) to encourage participation in sport</p>	<p>£1400</p>	<p>New, high quality equipment available for children to use during PE lessons.</p>

<p>Weekly swimming: Children across KS2 took part in weekly swimming sessions run by the local sports centre.</p>	<p>£1720</p>	<p>All children able to access the swimming curriculum and last year all Y6 pupils achieved the expected standard.</p>
<p>Dinner time play leader. The school to employ an adult to act as a games leader for the children during dinner time. Selected pupils, who would not usually choose to play sport, were chosen to participate in team games.</p>	<p>£850</p>	<p>Children who wouldn't normally have chosen to take part in sports / games enjoyed their sessions and were physically active throughout.</p>
